AN ACT RESPECTING CONSTABLES.

(Assented to

HIS MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows;—

Justices may
appoint
constables.

Duration
of
office.

1. Any justice of the peace may in writing appoint one or more constables whose powers and duties as such shall extend to the whole of the Province; such appointment to be in force for the time mentioned in the appointment, but shall at no time be longer in force than until the thirty-first day of December then next following the date of such appointment, or until any process on the said thirty-first day of December in his hands ~~is~~ be executed.

Oath,

2. Every constable so appointed shall before entering upon the duties of his office, take and subscribe before a justice of the peace, the following oath:

I, _____ having been appointed constable for the Province of Alberta, do solemnly swear that I will truly, faithfully and impartially perform the duties appertaining to the said office, according to the best of my skill and ability. So help me God.
