A BILL TO AMEND THE ALBERTA EVIDENCE ACT

Section 1 of the Bill introduces a new section 34a which provides for copies of the records of births, marriages and deaths certified by the proper officers in other Provinces to be admitted in evidence in Alberta.

An Act to amend The Alberta Evidence Act.

(Assented to _____, 1945.)

HIS MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

1. *The Alberta Evidence Act*, being chapter 106 of the of the Revised Statutes of Alberta, 1942, is hereby amended by adding immediately after section 34 thereof the following new section:

“**34a.** A copy of the record of any birth, marriage or death in the possession of a Department of the Government of any Province of Canada purporting to be certified by the officer in whose custody the original record is, to be a true copy of the original, shall be admissible in evidence as proof of the original record and of its possession by the Department.”

2. This Act shall come into force on the day upon which it is assented to.
