A BILL TO AMEND THE LAND SALES
PROHIBITION ACT.

NOTE.

It is now provided by section 9a of this Act that it shall remain in force until the cessation of hostilities with Germany and Japan and for one year thereafter. As no proclamation has yet been issued as to the termination of hostilities in so far as that affects this Act, it is considered advisable to fix a definite date when the Act will cease to be in force, and the purpose of this Bill is to fix such date, namely, May 1st, 1947.

BILL

An Act to amend The Land Sales Prohibition Act.

(Assented to _____, 1946.)

HIS MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

1. *The Land Sales Prohibition Act*, being chapter 15 of the Statutes of Alberta, 1944, is hereby amended as to section 9a by striking out the same and by substituting therefor the following:

“9a. This Act shall remain in force until the first day of May, 1947.”

2. This Act shall come into force on the day upon which it is assented to.
