A BILL RESPECTING THE EDUCATION OF THE  
CHILDREN OF DECEASED AND DISABLED SER-  
VICE MEN.

NOTE.

This Bill is along the same lines as a previous Act passed in 1930 with reference to the first Great War. The purpose of the Bill is to implement the recommendation of the special committee appointed to investigate the question of granting of assistance towards the cost of secondary education for children of deceased and disabled ex-service men.

Section 3 of the Bill provides for the appointment of a board which shall serve without remuneration to administer the moneys voted for the purpose by section 4.

Section 5 of the Bill provides for the making of regulations for the direction of the said board and also provides that in lieu of appointing a board, the Lieutenant Governor in Council may delegate the duties of the board to some other existing board or body of persons.

# BILL

No. 81 of 1946.

An Act Respecting the Education of the Children of  
Deceased and Disabled Service Men.

(Assented to \_\_\_\_\_, 1946.)

**H**IS MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

1. This Act may be cited as "*The Education of the Children of Deceased and Disabled Service Men's Act.*"

2. In this Act unless the context otherwise requires, "service man" means any person who, since the first day of September, 1939, has left his usual occupation for the purpose of joining and who has joined for full time service in World War II any of the active naval, military or air forces of His Majesty or the allies of His Majesty, and includes a member of the permanent force of His Majesty on active service.

3. The Lieutenant Governor in Council may appoint a board consisting of three persons who shall serve without remuneration for a period of three years and shall be eligible for re-appointment, and such board shall be charged with the duty of applying all moneys received by it under the provisions of this Act for the purpose of providing secondary educational facilities for the children of service men who enlisted for service in World War II and who died or were disabled as the result of war service, and who were resident in the Province at the time of their enlistment.

4. In the fiscal year ending March 31st, 1947, there may be paid and applied from and out of the General Revenue Fund a sum or sums not exceeding in the whole ten thousand dollars for the purpose aforesaid, and in subsequent fiscal years such sums as may be appropriated for the purpose by the Legislature.

5.—(1) The Lieutenant Governor in Council may make such regulations as may be deemed necessary or proper for the guidance and direction of the said board in the distribution of the said sum or sums of money and in particular may define the educational facilities which may be provided by the board.

(2) In lieu of appointing any such board, the Lieutenant Governor in Council may delegate the duties of a board under this Act to any existing board or body of persons.

**6.** This Act shall come into force on the day upon which it is assented to.
