

Bill No. 20 of 1947.

A BILL TO AMEND THE SOLDIERS' RELIEF ACT

NOTE.

This Bill amends section 2, subsection (2) of the above Act by adding a new paragraph (*dd*) immediately after paragraph (*d*). Paragraph (*d*) provides that for the purposes of the Act which relates principally to tax exemption, a soldier shall cease to be a soldier at the expiration of the calendar year in which he is discharged in the ordinary course other than for the causes set out in clause (i) of paragraph (*d*). It has been considered desirable to fix a limit of tax exemption at the end of the year 1947 for soldiers who have not been discharged. It is understood that a considerable number of soldiers have transferred into the permanent forces without taking their discharge. It has been found necessary to fix a cut-off date for the tax exemption. This has been fixed at the end of the year 1947.

An Act to amend The Soldiers' Relief Act.

(Assented to _____, 1947).

HIS MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

1. *The Soldiers' Relief Act*, being chapter 146 of the Revised Statutes of Alberta, 1942, is hereby amended as to section 2 by adding immediately after paragraph (d) of subsection (2) thereof the following new paragraph:

“(dd) After serving for six months a soldier shall be deemed to have ceased to be a soldier for the purposes of this Act at the expiration of the calendar year 1947, notwithstanding that he has not in fact been discharged;”.

2. This Act shall come into force on the day upon which it is assented to.
