

Bill No. 75 of 1947.

A BILL TO AMEND THE GOVERNMENT LIQUOR
CONTROL ACT OF ALBERTA

NOTE.

Section 1 of this Bill amends section 29 of the Act. Paragraph (b) of subsection (2) requires a club to be in operation for three years before a license may be obtained. The amendment reduces the period of operation to one year in the case of ex-servicemen's clubs and clubs of the American Legion.

Section 2 of the Bill strikes out section 31 dealing with canteens and enacts a new section. The terms of the new section are brought up to date and are extended to the active and reserve units of the Royal Canadian Navy and Royal Canadian Air Force and of the Royal Air Force and to premises occupied by active United States Forces.

An Act to amend The Government Liquor Control Act of
Alberta.

(Assented to _____, 1947.)

HIS MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of
the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta,
enacts as follows:

1. *The Government Liquor Control Act of Alberta*, being chapter 24 of the Revised Statutes of Alberta, 1942, is hereby amended as to section 29 by adding immediately at the end of paragraph (b) of subsection (2) thereof the following proviso:

“Provided, however, that the provisions of this paragraph shall not apply to a club which is a recognized ex-service-men’s club associated with a national organization or to a club of an American Legion Post, and in any such case it has been in continuous operation for one year.”

2. The said Act is further amended as to section 31 by striking out the same and by substituting therefor the following:

“31. If authorized by the regulations, and in accordance therewith, the Board may grant a license in respect of a canteen, entitling the person in control of the canteen to purchase beer from a vendor, and to sell it, by the glass or open bottle, for consumption on the premises, in accordance with the regulations and this Act, in camps, armouries or barracks of active and reserve units of the Royal Canadian Navy, the Canadian Army, the Royal Air Force and the Royal Canadian Air Force under direct supervision and control of the respective services, and also in quarters of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police and premises of units of the American Legion consisting of members of the active United States Forces.

3. This Act shall come into force on the day upon which it is assented to.
