

Bill No. 54 of 1948.

A BILL TO AMEND THE ALBERTA POLICE ACT

NOTE.

This Bill amends *The Alberta Police Act*.

Section 22 (4) of the Act required the clerk or secretary-treasurer of a municipality to give the Commissioner of Police of the Alberta Provincial Police Force a statement of the names and addresses of all municipal constables appointed. Since the Royal Canadian Mounted Police took over the policing of the Province there has accordingly been no complete official record of all constables in the Province.

The purpose of the amendment is to require municipalities to report the appointments of constables to the Attorney General so that the Attorney General may maintain a complete up-to-date record of all constables in the Province.

BILL

An Act to amend The Alberta Police Act.

(Assented to _____, 1948.)

HIS MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

1. *The Alberta Police Act*, being chapter 109 of the Revised Statutes of Alberta, 1942, is hereby amended as to section 22 by striking out subsection (4) thereof and by substituting therefor the following:

“(4) The clerk or secretary-treasurer of each municipality shall give notice in writing to the Attorney General forthwith upon the appointment and upon the termination of the appointment of each constable appointed by the municipality, except in the case of a constable appointed for any period less than eight days, and such notice shall state the full name and address of each constable.”.

2. This Act shall come into force on the day upon which it is assented to.
