A BILL TO AMEND THE MARGARINE ACT.

NOTE.

This Bill amends *The Margarine Act*, being chapter 62 of the Statutes of Alberta, 1949.

Section 3 (b) is amended. This clause presently requires that the wrapper or container of margarine shall have the word "margarine" stamped on the main panel as the most conspicuous word on that panel. The laws of the other provinces relating to margarine do not require that the word "margarine" be the most conspicuous word on the package. The amendment will bring the Alberta provision into conformity with the corresponding provision in most of the other provinces. The wrapper or container, in which any particular brand of margarine is marketed, is usually the same for all provinces. Frequently the brand name is of approximately the same size and prominence on a container as the word "margarine" and whether it is equally conspicuous is a difficult matter to determine. The words in question are accordingly struck out.

HIS MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

- **1.** The Margarine Act, being chapter 62 of the Statutes of Alberta, 1949, is hereby amended as to section 3, clause (b) by striking out the words "as the most conspicuous word thereon".
- 2. This Act shall come into force on the day upon which it is assented to.
