#### A BILL TO AMEND THE POWER COMMISSION ACT.

#### NOTE.

This Bill amends The Power Commission Act, being chapter 5 of the Statutes of Alberta, 1944.

Subsection (1) of section 24 is struck out and a new subsection is substituted. The effect of the amendment is to change the period covered by the annual report from the year ending the thirty-first of March to the year ending on the thirty-first of December. As a result of the amendment a report can be tabled in the Legislative Assembly covering the immediately preceding calendar year. Under the present section a report cannot be tabled until it is approximately a year old.

**H**IS MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

**1.** The Power Commission Act, being chapter 5 of the Statutes of Alberta, 1944, is hereby amended.

**2.** Section 24 is amended by striking out subsection (1)  $\frac{1}{1}$  section 24 and by substituting the following:

"24.—(1) The Commission shall make an annual re-Annual port to the Minister covering the twelve months' period report ending on the thirty-first day of December in each year and showing,—

(a) its revenues and expenditures for the period;

- (b) a complete statement of its reserve funds;
- (c) an audited balance sheet of its financial transactions for the period;
- (d) such other information as the Lieutenant Governor in Council requires.".

3. This Act shall come into force on the first day of July, Coming into into force
