

Bill No. 49 of 1951.

A BILL TO AMEND THE GRAIN BUYERS'
LICENSING ACT.

NOTE.

This Bill amends *The Grain Buyers' Licensing Act*, being chapter 46 of the Revised Statutes of Alberta, 1942.

Sections 9, 10, 11 and 12 are struck out and new sections substituted. The present sections 9 and 10 of the Act require the yearly renewal of a license and it is considered that a license should not be required to be renewed yearly, but should be permanent as long as the individual is in business or until the license is cancelled, suspended or revoked by the Minister for cause.

The new section 11 applies to any licensee and requires him to notify the Minister by registered mail in writing when he ceases to carry on business.

Section 12 is amended to provide for a penalty to any licensee who fails to send a notice and return his license when he has ceased to carry on business.

The Bill comes into force on the 1st day of July, 1951.

An Act to amend The Grain Buyers' Licensing Act.

(Assented to _____, 1951.)

HIS MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

1. *The Grain Buyers' Licensing Act*, being chapter 46 of the Revised Statutes of Alberta, 1942, is hereby amended.

2. Sections 9, 10, 11 and 12 are struck out and the following are substituted:

Sections 9, 10, 11 and 12 amended

9. Every license issued under this Act shall remain in effect until cancelled, revoked or suspended for cause by the Minister.

Minister may cancel, revoke or suspend license

10. The fee payable for a license to a grain buyer or an agent shall be such amount as the Minister may fix by order published in *The Alberta Gazette*.

License fee

11. A licensee who ceases to carry on the business of a grain buyer or agent shall send a notice in writing by registered mail to the Minister and shall return his license together with the notice.

Notice of cessation of business

12. Any person who,—

“(a) carries on or transacts the business of a grain buyer in the Province in contravention of this Act, or carries on or transacts any of the business of a grain buyer at any shipping point in the Province without first having obtained a valid and subsisting license under this Act; or

Penalty for offence

“(b) fails to send a notice and return his license in accordance with the provisions of section 11;

shall be guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a penalty of not less than two hundred dollars nor more than five hundred dollars and costs, and in default of payment forthwith to a term of imprisonment of not more than ninety days.”.

3. This Act shall come into force on the first day of July, 1951.
