

Bill No. 66 of 1951.

A BILL TO AMEND THE DOMESTIC ANIMALS
ACT (MUNICIPALITIES).

NOTE.

This Bill amends *The Domestic Animals Act (Municipalities)*, being chapter 91 of the Revised Statutes of Alberta, 1942.

Section 53 is amended. The section now provides that the owner may redeem animals sold by reimbursing the purchaser for the expense of feeding and maintaining the animals while they were in his possession at a rate fixed by the section.

The effect of this amendment is to revise the rate of feeding costs upwards to cover present day costs.

This Bill comes into force on the 1st day of July, 1951.

HIS MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

1. *The Domestic Animals Act (Municipalities)*, being chapter 91 of the Revised Statutes of Alberta, 1942, is hereby amended.

2. Section 53 is amended by striking out all the words following the word "follows" and by substituting the following: Section 53 amended

" , for each day or fraction thereof

"(a) for a stallion, bull, jack or boar	\$1.00	<small>Feeding expense charges</small>
"(b) for a ram or he-goat	.40	
"(c) for a horse, mule, ass, head of cattle or swine	.75	
"(d) for a sheep or goat	.25	
"(e) for a goose	.15	

the purchaser on payment of the said fee shall forthwith deliver over to the owner any animal or animals so redeemed".

3. This Act shall come into force on the first day of July, 1951. Coming into force
