## BILL

No. 2 of 1952.

An Act to Incorporate the Alberta Safety Council.

, 1952.)

WHEREAS The Alberta Safety Council, a body corporate Preamble organized under The Societies Act, being chapter 245 of the Revised Statutes of Alberta, 1942, has petitioned for an Act constituting its present officers and directors hereinafter named a body politic and corporate;

And whereas it is expedient to grant the prayer of the said petitioner;

Therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

Ritson-Bennett of Drumheller, Alberta, Ira McLaughlin of Grande Prairie, Alberta, James C. Jefferson, C.B.E., J. W. McDiarmid, Charles H. Grant, K.C., Howard Stutchbury, Charles Simmonds, Herbert McPherson, Alfred P. Gregory, Arnold F. Moir, Walter A. Kerr, John L. DeVoin, H. P. Brown and Fred T. Jenner, all of Edmonton, Alberta, E. J. Martin of Fairview, Alberta, William T. Hill and S. R. Lamb of Lethbridge, Alberta, E. Amos and Donald Hawthorne of Medicine Hat, Alberta, R. D. Jorgenson of Pembina, Alberta, Paul Crawford and Kenneth O'Callaghan of Red Deer, Alberta, and such other persons as may become members of the corporation, are hereby incorporated and constituted a body politic and corporate under the name of Alberta Safety
- 2. This Act may be cited as "The Alberta Safety Council Short title Act".
- 3. The objects of the corporation are to promote safety Objects and to promote the prevention of accidents.
  - 4. The corporation may.—

Council, hereinafter called the corporation.

Powers

- (a) acquire land by purchase, lease, gift, or otherwise hold, sell, lease and turn the same to account for the purposes of the corporation;
- (b) generally do and perform such acts and undertake such undertakings as appear, in the opinion of the directors, to or likely to promote the objects of the corporation;
- (c) establish by-laws for the government of the corporation:
- (d) establish branches within the Province from time to time and provide for the government and regulation thereof;
- (e) affiliate with any existing corporation;
- (f) borrow money for the purposes of the corporation.

Members not to share in profits 5. No part of the income of the corporation shall be available for the personal benefit of any member of the corporation.

Membership qualifications and terms thereof

- 6. (1) The corporation shall from time to time determine the qualifications required of and the terms upon which persons may be admitted to membership and may impose a membership fee payable in a lump sum or annually or otherwise, but shall not be bound to impose any fee whatsoever in establishing qualifications of or terms of admission to membership.
- (2) The corporation may differentiate between different classes of members as to qualifications, terms of admission, fees and manner of payment.
- (3) In this Act, "persons" shall include corporations however created, associations and societies and organizations incorporated or not incorporated.

Management 7. The management of the corporation shall be vested in a Board of Directors, elected as provided from time to time by the by-laws of the corporation, with power to delegate such powers and duties, as the Board may from time to time determine to a committee or committees, or one or more persons, or to such officers as to the board appear advisable, unless and to such extent such delegation may be prohibited by by-law.

First officers 8. Until otherwise determined, the officers and directors shall be the persons named in section 1 and each of the said persons shall hold and occupy the same office or appointment which such person now holds in The Alberta Safety Council.

Use of

9. No corporation, society, or organization, whether incorporated or not, within the Legislative authority of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, shall use, as a part of the name under which it operates, the words

"safety council", unless it is a branch of the corporation or the use thereof is authorized by the corporation.

10. (1) Upon the directors of The Alberta Safety Vesting of Council, which was incorporated under The Societies Act, passing a resolution to that effect, all of the assets of that Association shall be vested in the corporation, and thereupon the corporation shall become and be liable for the debts and be required to implement the contracts of the said The Alberta Safety Council.

- (2) Until otherwise determined by the corporation, re-temporary ceipt of those persons presently authorized to give receipts officers for obligations discharged to the said The Alberta Safety Council shall be sufficient to discharge the obligors, and the signature of those officers, presently designated as signing officers for the said association, shall be effectual to discharge any bank or banks in respect of the corporation.
- 11. This Act shall come into force on the day upon which Coming into force it is assented to.
