No. 6 of 1952.

An Act for Granting to Her Majesty Certain Sums of Money for the Public Service for the Fiscal Years Ending Respectively the Thirty-first day of March, 1952, and the Thirty-first day of March, 1953.

(Assented to _____, 1952.)

Most Gracious Sovereign:

WHEREAS it appears by Messages from His Honour John J. Bowlen, Lieutenant Governor of the Province of Alberta, and the Estimates accompanying the said Messages, that the sums hereinafter mentioned are required to defray certain expenses of the Public Service of Alberta not otherwise provided for during the financial periods ending respectively the thirty-first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and fifty-two, and the thirty-first day of March, one thousand, nine hundred and fifty-three, and for other purposes relating thereto:

May it therefore please Your Majesty that it be enacted, and be it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, as follows:

1. This Act may be cited as "*The Appropriation Act, 1952*".

2. From and out of the General Revenue Fund there may be paid and applied a sum not exceeding in the whole, eleven million and fifty-two thousand, six hundred and forty-eight dollars and fifty-two cents, towards defraying the several charges and expenses of the Public Service from the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and fifty-one, to the thirty-first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and fifty-two, not otherwise provided for and set forth in Schedule A to this Act.

3. From and out of the General Revenue Fund, there may be paid and applied a sum not exceeding in the whole one hundred and twenty-five million, eight hundred and sixty-one thousand, nine hundred and seventy dollars, towards defraying the several charges and expenses of the Public Service from the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and fifty-two, to the thirty-first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and fifty-three, not otherwise provided for, and set forth in Schedule B to this Act.

4. The due application of all moneys expended under this Act shall be accounted for.

5. This Act shall come into force on the day upon which it is assented to.
