A BILL TO AMEND THE WOODMEN'S LIEN ACT.

NOTE.

This Bill amends The Woodmen's Lien Act, being chapter 239 of the Revised Statutes of Alberta, 1942.

Section 6 is amended by striking out clause (c) of subsection (2) and by substituting a new clause (c). The section is further amended by adding a new subsection (2a)immediately after subsection (2). The effect of these amendments is to broaden the woodman's lien to cover the lumber made out of the logs or timber upon which he had a lien so long as the lumber is not purchased and paid for in full by a *bona fide* purchaser for value. If the lumber has been purchased and not paid for in full by a *bona fide* purchaser for value the lien exists only to the extent of the unpaid balance at the time the purchaser receives notice of the lien.

This Bill comes into force upon assent.

HIS MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

1. The Woodmen's Lien Act, being chapter 239 of the Revised Statutes of Alberta, 1942, is hereby amended.

2. Section 6 is amended,—

Section 6 amended

- (a) by striking out clause (c) of subsection (2) and by substituting the following:
 - "(c) any lumber made out of any of the logs or timber aforesaid, so long as the lumber has not been sold to and fully paid for by a *bona fide* purchaser for value without notice of the lien.";
- (b) by adding immediately after subsection (2) the following new subsection:

"(2a) Notwithstanding subsection (2), clause (c), where the lumber is in the possession of a bona fide purchaser for value who purchased without notice, the lien created shall not exceed the amount unpaid for the lumber by the purchaser at the date he received notice of the lien.".

3. This Act shall come into force on the day upon which $\frac{Coming}{into force}$ it is assented to.
