

Bill No. 31 of 1952.

A BILL TO AMEND THE PUBLIC SERVICE ACT, 1947.

NOTE.

This Bill amends *The Public Service Act, 1947*, being chapter 6 of the Statutes of Alberta, 1947.

Section 19*a* is added. It provides that an employee shall retire from the public service upon attaining age sixty-five, unless, for special reasons, the Lieutenant Governor in Council upon the recommendation of the Director of Personnel arranges for the continued employment of the employee for a limited period or until a replacement is made. The retirement age provision is already in force in "*The Public Service Pensions Act*", and it is now provided for in this Act.

Section 30*a* is added to the Act. It provides that an employee in the public service shall deliver to the Director of Personnel a birth certificate, statutory declaration or other proof of age acceptable to the Director within one year after the commencement of his employment.

This Bill comes into force upon assent.

An Act to amend The Public Service Act, 1947.

HIS MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

1. *The Public Service Act, 1947*, being chapter 6 of the Statutes of Alberta, 1947, is hereby amended.

2. The following new section is added immediately after section 19: New section 19a

“Retirement.

“19a. When an employee attains the age of sixty-five Retirement years, he shall retire from the public service, unless the Lieutenant Governor in Council, upon the recommendation of the Director of Personnel, arranges for the continuation of the services of the employee for a limited period or until a replacement is made.”.

3. The following new section is added immediately after section 30: New section 30a

“30a. (1) An employee shall deliver to the Director of Personnel a birth certificate, setting out the date of the employee’s birth, or in case such a certificate is not procurable, shall deliver to him a statutory declaration or such other proof of age as may be acceptable to the Director. Proof of age

“(2) An employee shall deliver the birth certificate, statutory declaration or other acceptable proof of age, as the case may be, to the Director of Personnel within one year of the commencement of the employment of the employee.”.

4. This Act shall come into force on the day upon which it is assented to. Coming into force
