A BILL TO REPEAL THE JUVENILE OFFENDERS ACT

Note

This Bill repeals The Juvenile Offenders Act, being chapter 13 of the Statutes of Alberta, 1945.

The administration of matters relating to juvenile offenders and juvenile delinquents is being transferred from the Department of Public Welfare to the Department of the Attorney General. The provisions of Part II of The Child Welfare Act relating to juvenile delinquents and the provisions of The Juvenile Offenders Act are being consolidated and amended and will be introduced for enactment at the current session in one new Act known as "The Juvenile Court Act, 1952."

The provisions of this Act accordingly are no longer necessary and are being repealed.

This Bill comes into force on the 1st day of July, 1952.
