A BILL TO AMEND THE GOVERNMENT LIQUOR CONTROL ACT OF ALBERTA

NOTE.

This Bill amends *The Government Liquor Control Act of Alberta*, being chapter 24 of the Revised Statutes of Alberta, 1942.

Section 99a which was added to the Act in 1950 is amended. Subsection (1) makes it an offence for a proprietor, owner or manager of a cafe, dance hall, or similar places to permit the consumption of beer or liquor on his premises, and also makes it an offence for him to permit the bringing into his premises, or possession upon his premises any beer or liquor by anyone. Frequently patrons of these establishments bring or consume liquor on such premises unknown to the proprietor and despite every attempt of his to prevent it, whereupon the proprietor may be guilty of an offence. The subsection is amended to make it clear that the proprietor is guilty of an offence only when the beer or liquor is so consumed or possessed with his knowledge. Subsection (2) is amended to conform with the amendment to subsection (1).

This Bill comes into force upon assent.

HER MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

- 1. The Government Liquor Control Act of Alberta, being chapter 24 of the Revised Statutes of Alberta, 1942, is hereby amended.
 - **2.** Section 99a is amended,—
 - (a) by adding immediately after the word "shall", Section 99a where it occurs in subsection (1), the word "knowingly";
 - (b) by adding immediately before the word "violates", where it occurs in subsection (2), the word "knowingly".
- 3. This Act shall come into force on the day upon which Coming it is assented to.
