WHEREAS a petition has been presented by The Synod of ^{Preamble} the Diocese of Edmonton praying for an amendment to An Act to Incorporate the Synod of the Diocese of Edmonton and the Parishes of the said Diocese, as hereinafter set forth, and it is expedient to grant the prayer of the

Therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

1. An Act to Incorporate the Synod of the Diocese of Edmonton and the Parishes of the said Diocese, being chapter 48 of the Statutes of Alberta, 1914, is hereby amended.

2. The following new sections are added immediately $\frac{\text{New}}{\text{section } 5a}$ after section 5:

"5*a*. In addition to the powers of investments herein Investment provided for, The Synod of the Diocese of Edmonton shall of trust have the power to invest trust funds, in addition to trustee investments, in any securities authorized by the laws of the Dominion of Canada for the investment or lending by Canadian Life Insurance Companies of their funds, but that investments other than trustee investments be restricted to 30% of the total trust funds on the books of the Synod.

"5b. The Synod of the Diocese of Edmonton shall have Consolidation power to consolidate the trust funds under control of the funds Synod as one fund to be known as the Consolidated Trust Fund, and that all separate trusts comprising such fund shall share *pro-rata* the revenue to be derived from such Consolidated Trust Fund.".

3. This Act comes into force on the day upon which it is $_{force}^{Coming}$ into assented to.
