# A BILL TO REPEAL THE CITIES AND TOWNS EMERGENCY BORROWING POWERS ACT

#### Note

This Bill repeals The Cities and Towns Emergency Borrowing Powers Act, being chapter 165 of the Revised Statutes of Alberta, 1942.

Section 622 of *The City Act* now makes provision for temporary borrowings by cities; *The Cities and Towns Emergency Borrowing Powers Act*, which actually applies only to cities, is not now used and is, therefore, repealed.

This Bill comes into force on the 1st day of July, 1953.
