A BILL TO AMEND THE INTERPRETATION ACT

Note

This Bill amends *The Interpretation Act*, being chapter 1 of the Revised Statutes of Alberta, 1942.

Section 2 is amended to obviate the necessity of repeating the expression "Unless the context otherwise requires" in the interpretation section of each Act of the Legislature.

Section 41 is amended to conform to the new Royal style and Royal title as adopted by an amendment to *The Interpretation Act* (Canada) by Parliament in an Act passed at the 1953 session.

This Act comes into force upon assent.

HER MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

1. The Interpretation Act, being chapter 1 of the Revised Statutes of Alberta, 1942, is hereby amended.

2. Section 2 is amended

"(2) Where an Act or regulation contains an in- Exceptions terpretation section or provision, it shall be read and construed as subject to the same exceptions as those contained in subsection (1).

3. Section 41 is amended by striking out clause (h) and Section 41 amended by substituting the following:

"(h) 'Her Majesty', 'His Majesty', 'the Queen', 'the King', "Her or 'the Crown' means the Sovereign of the United "His Kingdom, Canada, and Her other Realms and Ter- Majesty", "the Queen", ritories, and Head of the Commonwealth;".
