A BILL TO AMEND THE NOTARIES PUBLIC ACT

Note

This Bill amends *The Notaries Public Act*, being chapter 137 of the Revised Statutes of Alberta, 1942.

Section 8, subsection (1) is amended to bring the section into conformity with the present position of Canadian representation in foreign countries and with the functions of Canadian officials in foreign countries.

This Bill comes into force upon assent.

An Act to amend The Notaries Public Act

HER MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

- 1. The Notaries Public Act, being chapter 137 of the Revised Statutes of Alberta, 1942, is hereby amended.
- 2. Section 8, subsection (1) is struck out and the follow- section 8 amended ing is substituted:

"(a) who are officers of any of Her Majesty's diplomatic officers of any consular services exercising their functions in any country other than Canada, including ambassadors, envoys, ministers charges discrete."

Validity of caths of officers of diplomatic officers of diplomatic or consular services charges discrete. counsellors, secretaries, attaches, consuls-general, consuls, vice-consuls, pro-consuls, consular agents, acting consuls general, acting consuls, acting viceconsuls and acting consular agents, or

- "(b) who are officers of the Canadian diplomatic, consular and representative services exercising their functions in any country other than Canada, including, in addition to the diplomatic and consular officers mentioned in clause (a), high commissioners, permanent delegates, acting high commissioners, acting permanent delegates, counsellors and secretaries,
- "(c) who are Canadian Government trade commissioners and assistant Canadian Government trade commissioners while exercising their functions in any country other than Canada,

may in that country or place to which they have been appointed to exercise their functions administer any oath or affirmation and take any affidavit or statutory declaration and also do any notarial act that any notary public or commissioner to administer oaths can do within the Province.".

3. This Act comes into force on the day upon which it is Coming into force assented to.
