Bill No. 119 of 1954

A BILL TO PROVIDE COMPENSATION FOR MEMBERS OF THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY IN THE EVENT OF TOTAL DISABILITY OR DEATH

Note

This Bill enacts a new Act to be known as "The M.L.A. Compensation Act".

The effect of this Bill is to provide a plan of compensation in the event of the accidental death or accidental permanent total disability of members of the Legislative Assembly while performing their duties as members.

The members are brought under The Workmen's Compensation Act, 1948, and compensation would be payable thereunder as though the members were workmen within the meaning of that Act.

This Bill comes into force upon assent and is retroactive to October 1st, 1953.

An Act to Provide Compensation for Members of the Legislative Assembly in the Event of Total Disability or Death

(Assented to , 1954)

HER MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

Short title

1. This Act may be cited as "The M.L.A. Compensation Act".

Interpretation "Board"

2. In this Act,

(a) "Board" means the Workmen's Compensation Board established under The Workmen's Compensation Act, 1948;

"compensation"

- (b) "compensation" means
 - (i) in the case of a member of the Legislative Assembly, the maximum payments payable under section 34 and subsection (3) of section 39 of *The Workmen's Compensation Act*, 1948, to a workman suffering permanent total disability, and
 - (ii) in the case of a dependant of a member of the Legislative Assembly, compensation equivalent to and payable in the same manner and upon the same basis as the compensation payable under The Workmen's Compensation Act, 1948, to a similar dependant of a workman under that Act;
- (c) "duty as a member of the Legislative Assembly" includes
 - (i) travelling to and from sessions of the Legislative Assembly,
 - (ii) travelling to and from any Committee of the Legislative Assembly,
 - (iii) travelling within or without the Province on the business of the Legislative Assembly, any Committee thereof or on the business of the Government of Alberta, and
 - (iv) in the case of a member of the Executive Council all his duties as a member of the Executive Council;

"duty as a member of the Legislative Assembly"

- (d) "member of the Legislative Assembly" includes a "member of the Executive Council; Assembly"
- (e) "permanent total disability" means personal in- "permanent jury to the extent that the member of the Legis-lative Assembly would, if he were a workman under The Workmen's Compensation Act, 1948, be found to be permanently totally disabled.

3. Where an accident arising out of and in the course Payments of the performance of any duty of a member of the Legislative Assembly results in the permanent total disability of or death to the member of the Legislative Assembly, compensation shall be paid therefor by the Board

- (a) to or on behalf of the disabled member of the Legislative Assembly in the case of his permanent total disability, or
- (b) to or on behalf of the dependants of the member in the case of his death.

4. Compensation shall be paid in the case of permanent Commencetotal disability to a member of the Legislative Assembly ment of payments from the date of such disablement and in the case of the death of a member to or on behalf of his dependants from the date of his death.

5. The Board shall administer this Act and pay com-Adminis-tration of the persons entitled thereunder. pensation to the persons entitled thereunder.

6. The Provincial Treasurer shall pay to the Accident to Accident Fund established pursuant to The Workmen's Compensation Fund Accident Act, 1948, such sums as are required by the Board in the administration of this Act and for the payment of compensation under this Act.

7. Claims for compensation under this Act shall be made Claims for to the Board and determined by the Board under this Act sation and The Workmen's Compensation Act, 1948.

8. (1) The Workmen's Compensation Act, 1948, with Application whatever changes are necessary applies to members of the Workmen's Legislative Assembly and their dependants as if such Sation Act, members and their dependants were workmen or dependants ¹⁹⁴⁸ of workmen, respectively, under that Act.

(2) For the purposes of this Act the term "employer" in The Workmen's Compensation Act, 1948, shall be deemed to refer to the Clerk of the Legislative Assembly.

9. No compensation shall be paid under this Act to or in Ineligibility respect of a person while pension payments for his previous sation compen service on the Executive Council are being paid under The Public Service Pension Act to or in respect of that person.

10. This Act comes into force on the day upon which it is Coming into assented to and upon so coming into force shall be deemed to have been in force at all times on and after the first day of October, 1953.
