2. Subsection (2) of section 3c provided that the cost of testing and vaccinating all cattle and all heifers, respectively, in a brucellosis restricted area is payable to the veterinarian and that such cost is recoverable in any court. The amended subsection provides, additionally, that the relevant municipality may recover the costs on behalf of the veterinarian, as he is actually working for the municipality when vaccinating in brucellosis restricted areas.

3. Part II will relate the amendment to the revision.

An Act to amend The Live Stock Diseases Act

#### (Assented to , 1956)

**H**<sup>ER</sup> MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

#### PART I

**1.** The Live Stock Diseases Act, being chapter 10 of the Statutes of Alberta, 1946, is hereby amended.

**2.** Section 3c is amended by striking out subsection (2) and by substituting the following:

"(2) The cost of such testing and vaccination is payable by the owners of the cattle tested or vaccinated to the veterinarian performing the service.

"(3) In default of payment by an owner, the cost of such testing and vaccination may, for the benefit of the veterinarian who performed the service, be recovered in any court of competent jurisdiction by the municipal district, or county or by the Minister of Municipal Affairs in the case of an improvement district.".

#### PART II

**3.** The Live Stock Diseases Act, being chapter 182 of the Revised Statutes of Alberta, 1955, is hereby amended.

**4.** Section 6 is amended by striking out subsection (2) and by substituting the following:

"(2) The cost of such testing and vaccination is payable by the owners of the cattle tested or vaccinated to the veterinarian performing the service.

"(3) In default of payment by an owner, the cost of such testing and vaccination may, for the benefit of the veterinarian who performed the service, be recovered in any court of competent jurisdiction by the municipal district, or county or by the Minister of Municipal Affairs in the case of an improvement district.".

5. Part I and this section come into force on the day this Act is assented to, and Part II, except this section, comes into force and Part I is repealed on the day the Revised Statutes of Alberta, 1955, come into force.
