2. While the Act presently authorizes the Minister of Municipal Affairs to acquire real and personal property in respect of a special area, it does not apparently authorize him to dispose thereof. This Bill will so authorize him.

Part II relates the amendment to the revision and consolidation.

An Act to amend The Special Areas Act

H^{ER} MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

PART I

1. The Special Areas Act, being chapter 153 of the Revised Statutes of Alberta, 1942, is hereby amended.

2. Section 13 is amended by adding immediately after clause (k) the following:

"(kk) to dispose of, by public tender or otherwise, any real or personal property acquired by the Minister and no longer requisite for the purpose of or incidental to the exercise of any powers of administration in the Special Area;".

PART II

3. The Special Areas Act, being chapter 317 of the Revised Statutes of Alberta, 1955, is hereby amended.

4. Section 12 is amended by adding immediately after clause (m) the following clause:

"(*mm*) to dispose of, by public tender or otherwise, any real or personal property acquired by the Minister and no longer requisite for the purpose of or incidental to the exercise of any powers of administration in the special area;".

5. Part I and this section come into force on the day this Act is assented to, and Part II, except this section, comes into force and Part I is repealed on the day the Revised Statutes of Alberta, 1955, come into force.
