Explanatory Note

General. The purpose of this Bill is to extend present individual permits until such time as the Legislature has had an opportunity of dealing with the amendments to The Liquor Control Act contained in Bill No. 63.

HER MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of
the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta,
enacts as follows:

1. Notwithstanding section 21 of *The Liquor Control Act*,
being chapter 67 of the Statutes of Alberta, 1953, individual
permits granted under that Act and due to expire on the
thirty-first day of March, 1957, shall continue in force
and remain valid for such further period of time not exceed-
ing sixty days as may be prescribed by the Lieutenant
Governor in Council.

2. This Act comes into force on the day upon which
it is assented to.
