A Bill to amend The Interpretation Act

HON. MR. MANNING

Explanatory Note

The provision here being added to The Interpretation Act was first enacted by 1928, chapter 18, section 2 (10b). It does not appear in the uniform Interpretation Act and was omitted from 1958, chapter 32 unintentionally. It only applied in respect of Acts commencing after July 1st, 1928, but is here extended to apply to all "enactments" to which The Interpretation Act now generally applies, which would include regulations.

An Act to amend The Interpretation Act

(Assented to _____, 1959)

HER MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

1. *The Interpretation Act*, being chapter 32 of the Statutes of Alberta, 1958, is amended by adding immediately after section 18 the following section:

18a. Where an Act passed after the first day of July, 1928, or an enactment passed after the fourteenth day of April, 1958, authorizes or requires any document to be served by mail, whether the expression "serve", or the expression "give" or "send" or any other expression, is used, then, unless the contrary intention appears, the service shall be deemed to be effected by properly addressing, prepaying and posting a letter containing the document and, unless the contrary is proved, to be effected at the time at which the letter would have been delivered in the ordinary course of mail.

2. This Act comes into force on the day upon which it is assented to.
