Explanatory Note

The provision conferring jurisdiction on a judge of a Family Court is amended to make clause (b) conform to the description of maintenance orders under the Act that replaced the Act presently referred to in this provision. Section 4, as relevant, reads:

"4. Notwithstanding the provisions of any other Act, the Lieutenant Governor in Council by order may confer on a named judge of a Family Court exclusive original jurisdiction or joint or general jurisdiction over any or all of the following matters:

(b) maintenance orders for deserted wives and families made against any personyby a court in a reciprocating state and enforceable under The Maintenance Orders (Facilities for Enforcement) Act,".

H^{ER} MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

1. The Family Court Act, being chapter 108 of the Revised Statutes, is amended as to section 4 by striking out clause (b) and by substituting the following:

(b) maintenance orders made against any person by a court in a reciprocating state and enforceable under The Reciprocal Enforcement of Maintenance Orders Act,

2. This Act comes into force on the day upon which it is assented to.
