An Act to incorporate Le College St. Jean d'Edmonton

(Assented to , 1961)

Preamble

WHEREAS Les Reverends Peres Oblats des Territoires du Nord Ouest, commonly called the Oblate Fathers, one of the Religious Congregations of the Roman Catholic Church, was duly incorporated by chapter 96 of the Statutes of Canada, 1883, and has for its objects the establishment and carrying on of missions or parishes, schools, colleges and seminaries; and

WHEREAS a petition has been presented by Reverend Arthur Lacerte, O.M.I., and other members of the said Congregation engaged in the carrying out of some of the said objects in the Province of Alberta praying for the incorporation of a college to be conducted by some of the members of the said Congregation in the City of Edmonton under the name Le College St. Jean d'Edmonton.

AND WHEREAS it is expedient to grant the petition of the said prayer.

THEREFORE, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

Incorporation and objects

1. The Reverend Arthur Lacerte, O.M.I., the Reverend Joffre Pomerleau, O.M.I., and the Reverend Ferdnand Champagne, O.M.I., and such other members of the said Congregation as shall hereafter from time to time be associated with them in accordance with the constitution of the Congregation and such other members of the Congregation as shall from time to time be substituted for them in accordance with the said constitution are hereby constituted a body corporate and politic under the name of Le College St. Jean d'Edmonton and shall under that name have power to establish and conduct in the City of Edmonton a college and there and elsewhere in the Province of Alberta a school or schools where students may obtain liberal education in the arts and sciences and promote the study, practice and knowledge thereof and for such purposes to provide for the delivery and holding of lectures. exhibitions, classes and conferences calculated directly or indirectly to advance the cause of education whether general, professional or technical; to award certificates and diplomas, for merit and proficiency and to appoint such professors, associate professors, lecturers, instructors or other officers and servants as may be necessary for carrying into effect the objects and purposes of the corporation.

2. The affairs of the corporation shall be managed by M^{g nagement a council composed of the rector of the college and his advisors chosen according to the constitution of the Congregation and the council shall have power to make rules and regulations for the management of the affairs of the corporation and the persons designated by name in the first section of this Act shall be the provisional council thereof.}

3. The corporation shall have power from time to time Powers and at all times hereafter to acquire by gift, devise, purchase, lease or otherwise for its benefit any real property and to dispose of same by sale, mortgage, lease, exchange or otherwise and with the proceeds thereof acquire other real property or invest the same in any other property or security whatsoever for the use and benefit of the said corporation.

4. The corporation may borrow money for the purposes ^{Eorrowing} of the corporation and for the purpose of securing the repayment thereof may mortgage all or any of the real or personal property of the corporation.

5. All instruments relating to real property shall be Execution of instruments vided by the rules and regulations of the corporation.

6. Upon presentation to the Registrar of the proper vesting and titles office of any transfer or other instrument whereby any land or interest in land situate in Alberta is being transferred from Les Reverends Peres Oblats des Territoires du Nord Ouest, being a Corporation incorporated by chapter 96 of the Statutes of Canada, 1883, to the corporation hereby created, the Registrar may without fee or charge therefor do all things necessary to vest such land or interest therein in the name of the corporation, subject to all such encumbrances or charges as may be registered against the title thereof.

7. The corporation shall at all times whenever required Returns to do so by the Lieutenant Governor in Council make a report in writing of its affairs and property.

8. The powers herein granted shall be subject to the Limitation general laws of the Province now in force or hereafter of powers enacted.

9. This Act may be cited as "Le College St. Jean d'Ed- Short une monton Act".

10. This Act comes into force on the day upon which Coming into force it is assented to.
