Explanatory Note

2. This section is amended to give the judge a discretion in requiring that a plaintiff from a foreign jurisdiction appear before a maintenance order can be enforced under the provisions of this Act. Section 5 presently reads:

"5. At the time and place mentioned in the summons or at any other date appointed by a judge on adjournment, the judge shall inquire into (a) the resources of the defendant,

(b) his means and ability to comply with the order,(c) the disposal he has made of any property since the order was made,

(d) any and what debts are owing to him, and

(e) the circumstances under which he has made default in complying with the order,
and for that purpose shall examine on oath the plaintiff and the defendant and any witness produced on behalf of either of them.".

3. This amendment is to bring the reference up to date.

An Act to amend The Alimony Orders Enforcement Act

(Assented to , 1961)

H^{ER} MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

1. The Alimony Orders Enforcement Act, being chapter 12 of the Revised Statutes, is hereby amended.

2. Section 5 is amended

- (a) by renumbering the section as subsection (1),
- (b) by adding immediately after the renumbered subsection (1) the following:

(2) Notwithstanding subsection (1) where a maintenance order of a reciprocating state has been confirmed under *The Reciprocal Enforcement of Maintenance Orders Act* and the plaintiff is not within the Province the judge in his discretion may waive any examination of the plaintiff.

3. Sections 3, 15 and 16 are amended by striking out the words "The Maintenance Orders (Facilities for Enforcement) Act" and by substituting the words "The Reciprocal Enforcement of Maintenance Orders Act".

4. This Act comes into force on the day upon which it is assented to.
