An Act Providing for the Enrolment of Edward James Kenney as a Member of the Law Society of Alberta

(Assented to , 1962)

WHEREAS Edward James Kenney is a citizen of the United States of America, and was landed as an immigrant on July 12, 1960, and will not be eligible for citizenship in the Dominion of Canada before July 12, 1965, under and by virtue of Section 19(1) (c) of Chapter 33 of the Revised Statutes of Canada, namely, the Canadian Citizenship Act;

AND WHEREAS he is a member in good standing in the State Bar of Michigan, one of the United States of America, and of the American Bar Association;

AND WHEREAS he has completed all of the professional qualifications requisite for enrolment as a member of the Law Society of Alberta, with the exception of citizenship;

AND WHEREAS the taking of the present oath required for enrolment as a Barrister and Solicitor would leave him stateless under and by virtue of Section 1481 (a) (2) of Title 8 of The United States Code;

AND WHEREAS Edward James Kenney has duly filed his petition for such enrolment and it seems expedient that the prayer of the said petitioner be granted;

NOW THEREFORE, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

Enrollment in the Law Society

1. Notwithstanding existing legislation, rules and regulations, upon Edward James Kenney, a resident of the City of Edmonton, tendering payment of the appropriate fees, he shall be enrolled as a member of the Law Society of Alberta for a period of three years extending from July 15, 1962 to July 14, 1965, and upon such enrolment he shall be subject to all laws, rules and regulations not inconsistent with this Act.

Form of oath 2. The following oath is hereby prescribed to be taken by Edward James Kenney upon the occasion of his admission to practice, namely and to wit: "I, Edward James Kenney, of the City of Edmonton, in the Province of Alberta, do, without any equivocation, mental evasion or secret reservation, sincerely promise and swear:

(1) That I will not engage in any seditious or subversive activity against the Crown or against the Constitutional or other laws governing and obtaining in Canada; that I will diligently, faithfully, and to the best of my ability execute according to law the office of Barrister and Solicitor;

(2) That I will as a Barrister and Solicitor conduct all causes and matters faithfully and to the best of my ability; I will not seek to destroy any man's property; I will not be guilty of champerty or maintenance; I will not promote suits upon frivolous pretences; I will not pervert the law to favour or prejudice any man, but in all things conduct myself truly and with integrity, in fine, the public interest and that of my fellow citizen I will uphold and maintain according to the law in force in this Province.

So help me God."
