Explanatory Note

I. Section 16 reads:

- "16. A dining lounge licence or lounge licence shall be issued only to
- (a) a person of good reputation and character who is twenty-one or more years of age, a British subject and resident in Alberta for at least one year before the date of application,
 (b) a partnership of which each of the partners is qualified as provided in clause (a),
- (c) a railway corporation in respect of its hotels, trains or resort golf club houses,
- (d) a corporation that owns and operates hotels in connection with a railway and more than half of the stock of which is owned by a railway corporation, or
- (e) any other corporation that is incorporated or authorized to carry on its business in Alberta under the laws of Alberta, and of which a majority of the directors are, and the officers or agent who is in charge of the premises to be licensed is, personally qualified as provided in clause (a).".

HER MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

- 1. The Liquor Licensing Act, being chapter 38 of the Statutes of Alberta, 1958, is amended as to section 16
 - (a) by striking out the word "or" at the end of clause (d) and by adding the word "or" at the end of clause (e),
 - (b) by adding immediately after clause (e) the following new clause:
 - (f) a city that operates a dining room in the terminal building of its municipal airport.
- 2. This Act comes into force on the day upon which it is assented to.
