A Bill to amend The Chiropractic Act

HON. DR. ROSS

Explanatory Note

I. Section 4, subsection (4a) presently reads:

“(4a) A person
(a) whose name appears on the list established under clause (b) of subsection (4) of section 10, and
(b) who because of a tenet of his religious faith is precluded from accepting mandatory membership in an association,
may, with the approval of the Minister, practise chiropractic without becoming a member of the Association, but such a person is subject to all other provisions of this Act as if he were a member of the Association.”.

The purpose of the amendment is to make it clearer that a person who is exempted from membership in the Alberta Chiropractic Association because of his religious beliefs is otherwise subject to the same supervision and control as members.

An Act to amend The Chiropractic Act

(Assented to _____, 1963)

HER MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

1. *The Chiropractic Act*, being chapter 41 of the Revised Statutes, is amended as to section 4, subsection (4a) by adding immediately after the words "provisions of this Act" the words "and the regulations, and to the control of the Association,".

2. This Act comes into force on the day upon which it is assented to.
