A Bill to Provide for the Regulation of Aerial

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## **Explanatory Note**

General—This Act replaces and revises The Aerial Photographic Survey Act, R.S.A., 1955, c. 2. The principle changes are the removal of the requirements to furnish the Government with a negative of every photograph taken in an aerial survey, to furnish a cash bond and to deliver to the Government all data and photographs in the event that the licensee discontinues doing business in Alberta.

# BILL

No. 16 of 1964

## An Act to Provide for the Regulation of Aerial Photographic Surveys

(Assented to \_\_\_\_\_, 1964)

**H**ER MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

1. This Act may be cited as "*The Aerial Photographic Survey Act, 1964*".

2. In this Act,

- (a) "Director" means the Director of the Technical Division of the Department of Lands and Forests;
- (b) "licensee" means the holder of a licence issued under this Act;
- (c) "Minister" means the Minister of Lands and Forests.

3. This Act applies to all aerial photographic surveys made of any natural resources or lands in Alberta.

4. (1) No person shall make an aerial photographic survey of any natural resources or lands in Alberta, by himself or by an agent or contractor or otherwise, unless he is the holder of a licence issued under this Act.

(2) An application for a licence shall be made to the Director and shall show

- (a) the type of survey to be made,
- (b) the size and location of the area to be surveyed,
- (c) the focal length of the camera to be used, and
- (d) the scale of the photographs to be obtained.

(3) A licence may be issued by the Director or any person authorized by the Minister to do so upon payment of the fee prescribed by the Minister.

(4) A licence shall be in the form determined by the Director and may include such terms and conditions as the Director may prescribe.

5. A licence expires on the thirty-first day of March following its date of issue.

**9.** Section 14 revised. The maximum fine of \$3,000.00 for a single offence by a corporation and maximum \$25.00 per day fine for a continuing offence are removed.

**11.** Commencement of Act.

**6.** A licensee shall, not later than one month after the date of termination of a licence, submit to the Director

- (a) a flight index identifying the geographical position shown in every photograph taken during the term of the licence, and
- (b) a statement showing the dates and scales of the photographs taken and the focal length of the camera used to obtain them.

**7.** A licensee may transfer his licence with the consent of the Minister.

**8.** Where a licensee fails to comply with a provision of this Act, or his licence, the Minister may cancel the licence.

**9.** A person who contravenes this Act is guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding three hundred dollars.

**10.** This Act repeals and replaces *The Aerial Photographic Survey Act*, being chapter 2 of the Revised Statutes, but any licence issued under that Act on or after the first day of April, 1964, shall be deemed to have been issued under this Act.

**11.** This Act comes into force on the day upon which it is assented to.
