# BILL

No. 34 of 1964

An Act to Provide for the Exemption of Certain Land which is the Property of The Baptist Union of Western Canada from Assessment and Taxation

(Assented to \_\_\_\_\_, 1964)

Preamble      **W**HEREAS The Baptist Union of Western Canada, Edmonton, Alberta, has presented a Petition, praying for an Act to provide for the exemption of certain land belonging to The Baptist Union of Western Canada, from assessment and taxation, other than that relating to local improvements, and mines and minerals, and it is expedient to grant the Prayer of the said Petitioner :

THEREFORE, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows :

Exemption from taxation      **1.** The property located at the City of Calgary, in the Province of Alberta, described as follows, namely:

Block Two (2) as shown on Plan Altadore, Calgary, 1420 J.K.

Excepting thereout all mines and minerals, shall be exempt from assessment and taxation other than taxes relating to local improvements and taxes pertaining to minerals, so long as it shall remain registered in the name of The Baptist Union of Western Canada, and owned by it, and used by it for or in connection with educational and religious purposes.

Commencement of Act      **2.** This Act comes into force on the day upon which it is assented to.
