Preamble

WHEREAS Boys' Clubs of Calgary has presented a Petition praying for an Act to provide for the exemption from assessment and taxation, other than that relating to local improvements and mines and minerals, of certain land which is the property of Boys' Clubs of Calgary, and it is expedient to grant the prayer of the said Petitioner:

THEREFORE Her Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

Exemption from taxation

1. The property situated in the City of Calgary in the Province of Alberta and described as follows, namely:

Lots one (1), Two (2) and Three (3), all in Block Fifty-six (56) according to a plan of part of the City of Calgary in the Province of Alberta of record in the Land Titles Office for the South Alberta Land Registration District as Plan A Calgary; Excepting out of the said Lot One (1) and the West Half (W1/2) of the said Lot Two (2) all mines and minerals,

shall be exempt from assessment and taxation, other than taxes relating to local improvements, and mines and minerals, so long as the same shall be owned by Boys' Clubs of Calgary and used by it for or in connection with charitable purposes.

Commencement of Act 2. This Act comes into force on the day upon which it is assented to and upon so coming into force shall be deemed to have been in force at all times on and after the first day of January, 1964.
