Explanatory Note

- 1. The Execution Creditors Act, R.S.A. 1955, c. 103, amended.
- 2. Section 21, subsection (9) presently reads:

"(9) If the sum in dispute appears to be over one thousand dollars exclusive of costs the judge shall direct that the action be brought or the issue tried in the Supreme Court of Alberta, and, subject to any order which that court or a judge thereof may make in that behalf, shall name the district in which the trial is to take place.".

The amendment is consequential upon the change in 1963 to The District Courts Act whereby district court jurisdiction in money claims was increased from \$1000 to \$2000.

- 3. This Act comes into force on the day upon which it is assented to.
