An Act to Provide for the Exemption of Certain Land which is the Property of Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints from Assessment and Taxation

Preamble

WHEREAS, The President of the Lethbridge Stake, a corporation sole, of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints has presented a petition praying for an Act to provide for the exemption of certain lands owned by the said corporation sole, or held in trust for its benefit, from assessment and taxation other than that relating to local improvements and it is expedient to grant the prayer of the said Petitioner:

THEREFORE, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

Exemption from taxation

- 1. The following property situated at the City of Calgary. in the Province of Alberta, described as follows:
  - (a) Lot Seventeen (17) of Block "A" as shown on Plan Calgary 1790 A.M.

Excepting thereout the extra-roadway as shown on plan 1193 H.V. containing Five Hundredths (0.05) of an acre more or less,

shall be exempt from assessment and taxation other than taxes relating to local improvements and taxes pertaining to minerals so long as it shall remain registered in the name of the President of the Lethbridge Stake, a corporation sole, of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints, and owned by it or held in trust for it and used by it for or in connection with educational and religious purposes.

Commencement of Act 2. This Act comes into force on the day upon which it is assented to.
