Preamble

WHEREAS, the President of The Southern Alberta United Church Rehabilitation Lodge for Alcoholics, a corporation sole, has presented a petition praying for an act to provide for the exemption of certain lands owned by the said corporation sole, or held in trust for its benefit, from assessment and taxation other than that relating to local improvements and it is expedient to grant the prayer for the said Petitioner:

THEREFORE, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

Exemption from taxation

1. The following property situate in the City of Calgary, in the Province of Alberta, described as follows:

Lots Twenty-five (25) and Twenty-six (26) in Block One (1), as shown on Plan Thorncliffe Heights, Calgary, 4409 HY,

excepting thereout all mines and minerals,

shall be exempt from assessment and taxation other than taxes relating to local improvements so long as it shall remain registered in the name of The Southern Alberta United Church Rehabilitation Lodge for Alcoholics, a corporation sole, and owned by it or held in trust for it and used by it for or in connection with the rehabilitation of alcoholics.
