A Bill to repeal The Vendors' and Mortgagees' Costs Exaction Act

Explanatory Note

General. Chapter 357 of the Revised Statutes is repealed. This Act was intended to prevent vendors and mortgagees from charging excessive costs to purchasers and mortgagors by preventing them from charging any costs at all. This subject is now better regulated under other legislation such as The Unconscionable Transactions Act, The Mortgage Brokers Regulation Act and The Credit and Loan Agreements Act.

Clause 2 of the Bill repeals a section of chapter 220 of the Revised Statutes which made The Vendors' and Mortgagees' Costs Exaction Act inapplicable to mortgages authorized under the National Housing Act (Canada).

- 2. Section 4 of The National Housing Loans Act (Alberta) is repealed.
- 3. This Act comes into force on the day upon which it is assented to.
