A Bill to amend The Alberta Evidence Act

Explanatory Note

- 1. This Bill amends chapter 102 of the Revised Statutes.
- 2. Section 9 presently reads:

9. No witness in an action whether a party thereto or not is liable to be asked or shall be bound to answer a question tending to show that he or she has been guilty of adultery unless he or she has already given evidence in the same action in disproof of the alleged adultery.

This amendment is added in order to prevent the present section 9 from being used in a prosecution under the criminal law, to excuse a witness from being asked or from having to answer a question which might tend to show he or she has committed adultery, even though such question and answer might be vital in many cases to such a prosecution or to the defence to such a prosecution.

HER MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

- 1. The Alberta Evidence Act is hereby amended.
- 2. Section 9 is amended by renumbering the section as subsection (1) and by adding the following subsection:
- (2) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act, subsection (1) does not apply in the case of any prosecution for an offence against the criminal law of Canada.
- 3. This Act comes into force on the day upon which it is assented to.
