An Act to amend The Boilers and Pressure Vessels Act

(Assented to , 1968)

HER MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

1. The Boilers and Pressure Vessels Act is hereby amended.

- **2.** Section 4, subsection (2) is amended
 - (a) by striking out clause (a) and by substituting the following:
 - (a) a boiler two horsepower or less in capacity,
 - (b) as to clause (b) by adding after the word "boiler" the words ", hot water tank",
 - (c) by striking out clause (d) and by substituting the following:
 - (d) a pressure vessel six inches or less in internal diameter or one and one-half cubic feet or less in total volume,
 - (d) by striking out clause (e) and by substituting the following:
 - (e) a pressure vessel that is attached to a motor vehicle and has a valid inspection certificate issued in respect of it by another province or territory of Canada,
- (e) by adding the word "or" at the end of clause (h) and by striking out clause (i).

3. This Act comes into force on the day upon which it is assented to.

Explanatory Notes

- 1. This Bill amends chapter 27 of the Revised Statutes.
- 2. Section 4(2) clauses (a), (b), (d), (e) and (i) presently read: (2) This Act does not apply to
 - (a) steam boilers two horsepower or less in capacity and less than three cubic feet in volume,
 (b) a boiler or heating plant in a private residence occupied by not more than four families,
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 - (d) a pressure vessel six inches or less in internal diameter and one and one-half cubic feet or less in total volume,
 - (e) an air receiver or air pressure plant operating at, and with relief valves set at, fifty pounds per square inch or less.
 - (i) a pressure vessel having an internal diameter of not over twenty-four inches and used for the storage of hot water in a private residence occupied by not more than four families, or
