An Act respecting the Jurisdiction of Masters in Chambers

(Assented to , 1968)

HER MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

1. The Judicature Act is amended as to clauses (g) and (i) of section 32, subsection (18) of section 34 and subsection (4) of section 36 by striking out the words "a judge" and "the judge" wherever they occur and by substituting the words "the Court".

2. The Landlord and Tenant Act is amended as to section 12 by striking out the word "judge" wherever it occurs and by substituting the word "Court".

3. The Domestic Relations Act is amended as to subsection (3) of section 17 by striking out the word "judge" and by substituting the word "Court".

4. This Act comes into force on the day upon which it is assented to and upon so coming into force shall be deemed to have been in force at all times on and after April 1, 1968.

Explanatory Notes

1. This Bill will amend a number of statutes to substitute the word "court" for the word "judge" so that the duties and functions of a judge of the Supreme Court in the amended provisions may be exercised by a master in chambers who is an officer of the Court.
