AN ACT TO AMEND THE LOCAL AUTHORITIES PENSION ACT

(Assented to , 1971)

HER MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of Alberta, enacts as follows:

1. The Local Authorities Pension Act is hereby amended.

2. The following section is added after section 6:

6.1 (1) Where there is a delay beyond 30 days in processing the pension of a person who has retired from the service of a local authority he may be advanced money by the Provincial Treasurer out of any appropriation available for the purpose.

(2) Every advance shall be fully accounted for with proper vouchers for all disbursements made before a pension payment to which the person is entitled is made.

3. Section 8 is struck out and the following is substituted:

8. The Board may enter into reciprocal agreements with any

- (a) government or public body, or
- (b) private body which has assumed the duties and functions (or any part thereof) of a local authority,

whose employees are subject to a retirement pension plan or a superannuation plan involving employee contributions, and with any person who administers the pension plan on its behalf, to provide when a person moves

- (c) from the employment of such government or body to the employment of a local authority, or
- (d) from the employment of a local authority to the employment of such government or body,

for the transfer of any pension or superannuation benefits to which the person is entitled, subject to the approval of the Lieutenant Governor in Council and such agreements may be retroactive in effect.

4. This Act comes into force on the day upon which it is assented to.

Explanatory Notes

1. This Bill amends chapter 219 of the Revised Statutes of Alberta 1970.

2. Advances on forthcoming pensions.

3. Section 8 presently reads:

8. The Board may, subject to the regulations, enter into reciprocal agreements with any body whose employees are subject to a retirement pension plan or a superannuation plan involving employee contributions, and with any person who administers the pension plan on its behalf, to provide when a person moves

(a) from the employment of such body to the employment of a local authority, or
(b) from the employment of a local authority to the employment

(b) from the employment of a local authority to the employment of such body,
 for the transfer of any pension or superannuation benefits to which the person is entitled.
