AN ACT TO AMEND THE CRIMINAL INJURIES COMPENSATION ACT

(Assented to _____, 1971)

HER MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of Alberta, enacts as follows:

1. The Criminal Injuries Compensation Act is hereby amended.

2. Section 2, subsection (3) is amended by striking out the words "he shall, for the purposes of this Act, be deemed" and by substituting the words "the Board may, for the purposes of this Act, deem him".

*3. Schedule 1 is amended by adding the following item:
86 dangerous use of firearms.*

4. Schedule 2 is amended by striking out the following item:

*224 driving with more than 80 mgs. of alcohol in 100 mls.
of one's blood.*

5. This Act comes into force on the day upon which it is assented to and sections 3 and 4 shall be deemed to have come into force on March 1, 1971.

Explanatory Notes

1. This Bill amends chapter 75 of the Revised Statutes of Alberta 1970.

2. Section 2, subsection (3) presently reads:

(3) Notwithstanding that a person for any reason is legally incapable of forming a criminal intent, he shall, for the purposes of this Act, be deemed to have intended an act or omission that caused injury or death for which compensation is payable under this Act.

3. Addition to list of crimes in respect of which compensation is payable.
