THE TEACHING PROFESSION AMENDMENT ACT, 1972

(Assented to _____, 1972)

HER MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of Alberta, enacts as follows:

1. *The Teaching Profession Act is hereby amended.*
2. *Section 6 is amended by striking out subsections (3), (4), (5) and (6) and by substituting the following:*
 - (3) The association may grant associate, honorary, life or student membership to any person who meets the conditions prescribed by the by-laws.
3. *Section 7 is amended by striking out subsections (1) and (2) and by substituting the following:*
 7. (1) Active members have the right to vote and, subject to the by-laws, have the right to hold office in the association.
 - (2) Associate members have the right to vote and, subject to the by-laws, have the right to hold office in the association, but are not subject to the provisions of the by-laws relating to discipline and approved by the Lieutenant Governor in Council pursuant to section 15, subsection (1).
4. *Section 21, subsection (2) is amended by adding the words "and to the executive secretary of the association" at the end thereof.*
5. *This Act comes into force on the day upon which it is assented to.*

Explanatory Notes

1. This Bill will amend chapter 362 of the Revised Statutes of Alberta 1970.

2. Section 6, subsections (3), (4), (5) and (6) presently read:

(3) The association may grant associate membership to any person who meets the conditions prescribed by the by-laws.

(4) The association may grant life memberships to retired teachers under such conditions as may be prescribed by by-law.

(5) The executive council may confer honorary membership in the association on any person.

(6) Students who are enrolled in full-time courses of study above high school level either leading to or after first certification as teachers in the Province may become student members of the association under such conditions as may be prescribed by by-law.

3. Section 7, subsections (1) and (2) presently read:

7. (1) Active members have the right to vote and to hold office in the association and are subject to the provisions of this Act and the by-laws.

(2) Associate members have the right to vote and to hold office in the association but are not subject to the disciplinary provisions contained in this Act or the by-laws.

4. Section 21, subsection (2) presently reads:

(2) Every appeal shall be commenced by delivering a written notice of appeal to the registrar of the Department.
