#### THE MARGARINE AMENDMENT ACT, 1972

(Assented to

, 1972)

HER MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of Alberta, enacts as follows:

- 1. The Margarine Act is hereby amended.
- 2. Section 5 is struck out.
- 3. This Act comes into force on the day upon which it is assented to.

#### **Explanatory Notes**

1. This Bill will amend chapter 224 of the Revised Statutes of Alberta 1970

#### 2. Section 5 presently reads:

5. (1) No person shall within the Province, sell, offer for sale, have in his possession for sale or serve in a public eating place margarine coloured the natural colour of butter or a shade of yellow that might cause that margarine to be mistaken for butter.

(2) For the purpose of this section, margarine that has a tint or shade containing more than one and six-tenths degrees and less than ten and one-half degrees of yellow or of yellow and red collectively, measured in terms of the Lovibond tintometer scale, read under conditions substantially similar to those established by the United States Bureau of Internal Revenue, or the equivalent of such measurement, shall be deemed to be coloured the natural colour of butter or a shade of yellow that might cause that margarine to be mistaken for butter.

The result will be the removal of all restrictions relating to the colour of margarine.
