AN ACT TO AMEND THE CHILD WELFARE ACT

(Assented to

, 1973)

HER MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of Alberta, enacts as follows:

- 1. The Child Welfare Act is hereby amended.
- 2. Section 41 is amended:
 - (a) by striking out subsection (1) and substituting the following:
 - **41.** (1) Every person having information of, or on reasonable and probable grounds suspecting, the abandonment, desertion, ill-treatment or need for protection of a child shall report the information, or suspicions to the Director or any supervisor of the Department of Health and Social Development or a municipal welfare director or a solicitor acting on behalf of the Department of the Attorney General.
 - (b) by adding the following subsection after subsection(2):
 - (3) A person who fails to report information or suspicions as required in subsection (1) is guilty of an offence and liable upon summary conviction to a fine of not less than \$500 and not more than \$1,000, and in default of payment, to a term of imprisonment of not less than two months and not more than one year, or to both fine and imprisonment.
- 3. This Act comes into force on the day upon which it is assented to.

Explanatory Notes

A Bill making the reporting of child abuse mandatory. Section 41, subsection (1), presently reads:

41. (1) Every person having information of the abandonment, desertion, physical ill-treatment or need for protection of a child shall report the information to the Director or any supervisor of the Department of Social Development or a municipal welfare director or a solicitor acting on behalf of the Department of the Attorney General.
