AN ACT TO AMEND THE LIVESTOCK AND LIVESTOCK PRODUCTS

(Assented to

, 1974)

H^{ER} MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of Alberta, enacts as follows:

1. The Livestock and Livestock Products Act is hereby amended.

2. The following section is added after section 23:

23.1 (1) Every person who, being the owner of livestock, for the purpose only of publicizing his protest against the prices of or other market conditions prevailing with respect to livestock or any livestock product,

- (a) kills that livestock or causes that livestock to be killed, and
- (b) destroys or otherwise disposes of the livestock so killed without using it for or causing it to be used for the production of livestock products,

is guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine of not more than \$1000.

(2) Every person who, being the owner of livestock products, for the purpose only of publicizing his protest against the prices of, or other market conditions prevailing with respect to, livestock or any livestock product, destroys or otherwise disposes of those livestock products so that they cannot be used or consumed for the purpose for which they were intended, is guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine of not less than \$1000.

3. This Act comes into force on the day upon which it is assented to.

Explanatory Notes

1. This Bill will amend chapter 215 of the Revised Statutes of Alberta 1970.

2. "Livestock" and "livestock products" are defined in the Act as follows:

(b) 'ilvestock'' means horses, cattle, sheep, swine, fur-bearing animals raised in captivity, live poultry and bees:
(c) 'ilvestock products' means meat, raw hides, raw furs, dressed poultry, eggs, wool and honey in any form;
