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THE WORKERS' HEALTH, SAFETY AND COMPENSATION STATUTES AMENDMENT ACT, 1979

, 1979)

HER MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of Alberta, enacts as follows:

The Occupational Health and Safety Act

- 1(1) The Occupational Health and Safety Act is amended by this section.
- (2) The following is added after section 21:
 - **21.1**(1) The Minister may make grants if
 - (a) he is authorized to do so by regulations under this section, and
 - (b) there is authority available in a supply vote for the purpose for which the grant is to be made.
 - (2) The Lieutenant Governor in Council may make regulations
 - (a) authorizing the Minister to make grants;
 - (b) prescribing the purposes for which grants may be made;
 - (c) governing applications for grants;
 - (d) prescribing the persons or organizations or classes of persons or organizations eligible for grants;
 - (e) specifying the conditions required to be met by any applicant for a grant to render that person eligible for the grant;

Explanatory Notes

The Occupational Health and Safety Act

- ${f 1}(1)$ This section will amend chapter 40 of the Statutes of Alberta, 1976.
- (2) Allows the Minister charged with the administration of the Act to make grants.

- (f) prescribing the conditions upon which a grant is made and requiring the repayment thereof to the Government if the conditions are not met;
- (g) providing for the payment of any grant in a lump sum or by instalments and prescribing the time or times at which the grant or the instalments may be paid;
- (h) limiting the amount of any grant or class of grant that may be made;
- (i) authorizing the Minister to delegate in writing to any employee of the Government any duty, power or function respecting the payment of any grant;
- (j) requiring any person receiving a grant to account for the way in which the grant is spent in whole or in part;
- (k) authorizing the Minister to enter into an agreement with respect to any matter relating to the payment of a grant.
- (3) Any regulation made under subsection (2) may be specific or general in its application.

The Radiation Protection Act

- 2(1) The Radiation Protection Act is amended by this section.
- (2) Section 2(b) is repealed and the following is substituted:
 - (b) "Minister" means the member of the Executive Council charged by the Lieutenant Governor in Council with the administration of this Act;
- (3) Section 3(2) is amended by striking out "of the Department of Labour" and substituting "of the Government under his administration".

Commencement

3 This Act comes into force on the day upon which it is assented to.

The Radiation Protection Act

- $\mathbf{2}(1)$ This section will amend chapter 309 of the Revised Statutes of Alberta 1970.
- (2) Section 2 presently reads in part:
 - 2 In this Act,
 - (b) "Minister" means the Minister of Labour;
- (3) Section 3(2) presently reads:
 - (2) The Minister may authorize any employee of the Department of Labour to exercise any powers, duties and functions conferred upon the Minister by this Act.
