THE DEPARTMENT OF ADVANCED EDUCATION AND MANPOWER AMENDMENT ACT, 1981

(Assented to , 1981)

HER MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the
Legislative Assembly of Alberta, enacts as follows:

*1 The Department of Advanced Education and Manpower Act is
amended by this Act.*

2 Section 3.1 is amended

*(a) in subsection (1) by striking out “or the regulations” and
substituting “, any other Act under his administration or a reg-
ulation under those Acts”, and*

(b) in subsection (2) by striking out “under this Act”.

3 Section 4.1(2) is repealed.

*4 Section 4.2(2) is amended by adding the following after clause
(g):*

(g.1) authorizing the Minister to deduct from a grant any fees

Explanatory Notes

1 This Bill will amend chapter 28 of the Statutes of Alberta, 1972.

2 Section 3.1 presently reads:

3.1(1) Where the Minister is given any power or duty under this Act or the regulations, he may authorize one or more officers or employees in the Department to exercise or perform that power or duty upon such conditions or in such circumstances as the Minister prescribes and thereupon that power or duty may be exercised or performed by the officer or employee so authorized in addition to the Minister.

(2) Subsection (1) does not apply to the power of the Minister to make regulations under this Act.

3 Section 4.1(2) presently reads:

(2) The Minister may, on behalf of the Government of Alberta, enter into agreements relating to manpower resources, policies or programs

(a) with the Government of Canada or the government of a province or territory of Canada, if he has the approval of the Lieutenant Governor in Council to do so, or

(b) with any municipal corporation, agency, organization or other person.

4 New regulation making power by the Lieutenant Governor in Council.

or other charges for any matter or service provided by the Department or a provincially administered institution;

5 *The following is added after section 4.2:*

4.3 The Minister may establish and operate or authorize the operation of any advanced education programs and services he considers necessary or desirable.

6 *Section 5 is amended*

(a) *in clause (e) by adding “or a provincially administered institution” after “Department”,*

(b) *by adding the following after clause (e):*

(e.1) providing for the waiver of fees or other charges prescribed under this Act;

(c) *by repealing clause (h)(i) and substituting the following:*

(i) universities, public colleges, private colleges and provincially administered institutions, and

(d) *by adding the following after clause (h):*

(i) respecting the establishment of advisory or administrative committees at provincially administered institutions.

7 *Section 10 is repealed and the following is substituted:*

10 The Minister may enter into agreements on or in connection with any policies, programs, services or other matters under his administration.

In accordance with section 4(1) of The Interpretation Act, 1980, this Bill comes into force on the date it receives Royal Assent.

5 New section to authorize the establishment of advanced education programs.

6 Section 5(e) and (h)(i) presently read:

5 The Minister may make regulations

(e) prescribing fees or a tariff of fees to be charged for any matter or service provided by the Department;

(h) providing for the co-ordination of programs and services between

(i) universities, public and private colleges, institutes of technology, agricultural and vocational colleges and vocational training centres, and

New regulation making powers.

7 Section 10 presently reads:

10 The Minister may enter into agreements on any matter respecting advanced education or the operation of institutions for advanced education inside or outside Alberta.
